Thank you for contacting Friends of Woodland Park Avenue North. We are a dedicated coalition of people who live on Woodland Park Avenue in Wallingford. We have been working with city officials since 2019 to find a solution to the unsafe driving/roadway conditions on our street. If you live on Woodland Park Avenue, you know that although it's a 20 mph roadway (not an arterial), it's a popular cut-through for area drivers due to being very wide and straight. Drivers, pedestrians and school children crossing to school are all in danger every day. We are in the

process of creating a website for the project and will share the link as soon as it is completed.

You will be added to our mailing list to learn about upcoming events. We will be hosting drop-in information sessions throughout December and a community meeting in January 2024. Please join us to discuss the project. We are hoping to have a representative of SDOT at the meeting in January to explain the parameters of the project and to answer outstanding questions.
